The legal right to opt your child out of state-mandated EOC exams does not extend to opting your child out of assessments created by your child's teacher to measure their progress in the class.

If you choose to opt your child out of the state-mandated EOC exam, your child may be given an alternate assignment on the day of the exam.

The results of the EOC exams will be used as part of the student achievement measure of your child's teacher's performance evaluation and select EOC exams may be used to demonstrate competency for graduation.
